1. If  $[A] = \begin{bmatrix} 5 & 6 \\ 7 & -3 \end{bmatrix}$  and  $[B] = \begin{bmatrix} 2 \\ -3 \end{bmatrix}$

$$[A] = \begin{bmatrix} 25 & 30 \\ 75 & 35 \end{bmatrix}, \text{ and}$$

$$[B] = \begin{bmatrix} 2 \\ 7 \end{bmatrix},$$

the total sales amount in each month is given by
